The National Meeting in Poland was held in Piekary Slaskie and lasted from 9:00 until 16:00.

**Youth worked in groups on 7 issues. We used the world coffee method. Every 15 minutes they changed the tea table:**

1. HUMAN RIGHTS, POLITICAL PARTICIPATION, MEDIA & DEMOCRACY
2. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, ANIMAL RIGHTS & CLIMATE CRISIS
3. HEALTHCARE AND SOCIAL ISSUES
4. MIGRATION AND MOBILITY
5. SPARE TIME AND CONSUMPTION ISSUES
6. WORK AND LABOR
7. EDUCATION





In the second part of the meeting we did creative workshops. Youth could express their demands in an artistic way. They had a choice: poster or comic book, video, music, performance.

Youth worked in 3 groups. A film about environmental pollution, a poster and a cartoon about immigrants were created.



In the evaluation the majority of participants suggested the meeting was very good or good.

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**AT Meeting**

As some of the youth groups don't come from Vienna and needed the time to arrive, the meeting was scheduled from 11:00 – 18:00.

- Getting to know each other
- Session on Resistance
- Session on Participation and Collection of Demand
- Online-Exchange with Polish group
- Walking Tour in Vienna / Places of Resistance in Vienna

The Meeting started with a first getting to know other, as the participants came from different regions of Austria and different youth centers. After that the work on resistance, especially resistance of young people, was deepened and elaborated on different examples. The goal was to make them realize, what young people in resistance might have felt and that they and their ideas and demand for a better future really do matter.

After the break the young people were divided into 4 groups, in which they worked on their demands. The topics of the 4 groups were collected in the workshop and identified as those topics which are – at the moment – crucial to them.

The 4 topics were:

- Gender and identity
- Climate and environment
- migration and discrimination
- education system

The participants worked in structured way on these topics, with first thinking on what the problems are right now in this field, imagining, how it should be and then thinking about ways to get there.



After some time elaborating on that, they could do a presentation within the national group to include comments and feedback from them, before they prepared for the international exchange with the young people from Poland.



For the exchange each group presented the issue most important to them.



To round up the day, after hearing all the demands of the young people the program was meant to build the bridge to the historical input again. In connection with the other Austrian partner organization POLIS, a walking tour was organized, which highlighted memorable places in Vienna of resistance or which are directly connected to resistance.



The feedback on the meeting in general was good, also on the walking tour, even though it was in the end of a very full day of program (and some had to travel to Vienna to get there), so it was no surprise, that some of the young people were already a bit tired in this part of the agenda. But all in all most of the participatns expressed the wish to work further in the project on the topics.
